

Biography Daichi Nakamura

I started to learn the violin when I was 3 years old and taught by Eisuke Shinozaki.

I started to participate some competitions when I was 8 years old and got some following prizes in each one in Japan, awarded the 1st prize in the 3rd Nagoya International Music Competition, 2nd prize in the 7th Osaka International Music Competition in chambermusic section.

And I also got some international prizes in the following competitions, awarded the 5th prize in the 5th Tchaikovsky Competition for young musicians, the 3rd prize in the 8th Aram Khachaturian International Music Competition, the 1st prize in the Nedjalka Simeonova International Competition 2011, the 2nd prize in the Bled International Music Competition and 2nd prize (without 1st prize) in the 2nd Vasco Abadjev International Competition.

After the Nedjalka Simeonova International Competition, I played Beethoven Violin Concerto with Sofia Philharmonic Orchestra with Maestro. Angel Stankov who was the chairman of there and recommended me to play with.

And awarded also special prize in Kuhmo Chamber music Festival (in Finland) and Allegro Vivo Music Festival (in Austria). When I got the prize in Allegro Vivo Music Festival, it was broadcasted by ORF what I played in Galaconcert.

I played with following Orchestras, St. Peterburg Symphonic Orchestra, Kragensfurt Symphony Orchestra, Sofia Philharmonic Orchestra, Nagoya Philharmonic Orchestra, Kyushu Symphonic Orchestra, and so on.

I studied with Fuminori Shinozaki, Prof. Anastasia Chebotareva, Prof. Masafumi Hori.

And now I am studying in the University of Music and Performing Arts Vienna with Prof. Zienkowski and Prof. Michael Frischenschlager.
